RMUoHP Graduate Program Director speaks at International Conference

Dr. Martha Hartgraves, Graduate Program Director of the Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) degree program, spoke at the 2nd International Conference in Rehab Medicine in Guadalajara, Mexico on March 20, 2009. Since the scope of practice and the philosophical basis of the occupational therapy profession are not well defined in Mexico, the boundaries between some professions have become blurred. Dr. Hartgraves was asked to address this issue and spoke about the connections between related professions. More than 300 people attended the conference, including physicians, therapists, nurses, psychologists, social workers, and other healthcare professionals.
