RMUoHP holds 21st Annual ENMG Symposium

On March 19th and 20th Rocky Mountain University of Health Professions (RMUoHP) sponsored the 21st Annual Electroneuromyographic (ENMG) Symposium at the Marriott Hotel and Conference Center in Provo, Utah. Over 50 physical therapists and electromyography specialists from across the country participated in the symposium which featured research presentations and lectures on pathology and testing of nerves and muscles to assist in the identification of neuromuscular diseases.

Proceeds from the conference were donated to the American Congress of Electromyography (ACE). At the beginning of the conference, a check from last year's proceeds was presented by Dr. Richard P. Nielsen, President of RMUoHP, to John Palazzo, past president of the ACE and graduate of RMUoHP.

This year's keynote speaker was Sohrab Gollogly, MD, PC. Dr. Gollogly's presentation concentrated on "spinal implants." Dr. Sohrab Gollogly is a fellowship-trained orthopedic spine surgeon who practices in Monterey, California.
