RMUoHP holds Certification Course in the General Movement Assessment for Infants.

From June 9th to 12th, Rocky Mountain University of Health Professions (RMUoHP) held two certification courses in the General Movement Assessment for Infants at its campus in Provo, Utah. Attendees were instructed by the internationally recognized developmental neurologist and researcher from the Netherlands, Dr. Mijna Hadders-Algra.

Over 60 occupational therapists, nurses, physical therapists, physicians, and speech therapists attended training sessions which focused on assessment of general movements in both preterm and term gestation infants and prepared participants to use movement observation methodology in identifying newborns and infants at risk for neurological and developmental dysfunction. Proceeds from the courses were donated to the Pediatric Research Fund through the RMUoHP Foundation.
